# The History of Minor Park Golf Course

Before I began my time here at the golf course, I didn't really know much of the history that surrounds this 237 acre tract known as Minor Park Golf Course. But going through some old documents, I came across a newspaper article from 1966 that talked about how the city of Kansas City, Missouri began the process of building Minor Park.

The land that Minor Park sits on today was once a part of the Santa Fe Trail, which linked Independence, Missouri to the Southwest United States in the early 1800s. The river crossing, that is still present near the original Red Bridge, was used by many west-bound travelers due to a pair of firm limestone fords that sit across a fork in the Little Blue River. The ruts created from wagons previously ran right along where hole 14 is today. Currently, a plaque in the grassy lot adjacent to our shops marks this historical spot where the trail existed.

For years, the land that is now Minor Park was the farm home to the family of Dr. W.E. Minor. All the barn structures we currently use for our shops were originally part of their working farm. Later, Dr. Minor's daughter, Marie Minor Sanborn, and her husband, Thor Sanborn, resided here. When she passed away in December of 1941, she willed about 200 acres of the farm to the city of Kansas City as a park upon her husband's future death. Also, in her will she stated that the park was to be named for her father Dr. W.E. Minor. In 1956, Thor Sanborn passed away and the land was turned over to the city. Two years later the city limits were actually extended to include this property. Work began on the golf course in 1965 and it was dedicated in 1967.

Minor Park golf course was designed and built by Larry Flatt. The vision of Minor Park started in July of 1965 and in twelve months they had the first nine holes open for play. A year later the second nine was completed. As the course was being built there were a few problems along the way. A large amount of limestone needed to be removed in order to install irrigation for the greens, tees, and fairways. Throughout the 140 acres allotted for the 18 holes, 30 wet weather springs were discovered. The builders also came across what very few people knew existed in Jackson County, natural gas. The naturally occurring gas was in the ground in shallow wells and at one point there was enough of it to heat the house and barns on Minor Farm. The green construction followed USGA specifications and was grassed with Cohansey and Washington C-50. The tees and fairways were Princeton Bluegrass.

In the late 70's and early 80's, a small modification was made to the first few holes of Minor Park. The original design had the first three holes as a par 4, a par 3, and then a par 4. The modification eliminated the par 3 between the two par 4 holes and then a new par 3 was built in an



open area to become the new 16th hole.

In the early 90's, the City of Kansas City decided to flip the front nine and the back nine, bringing it what it looks like today. The thinking behind this switch was that they were not getting enough foot traffic coming off hole 9 into the clubhouse. By switching the sides they were able to allow the flow of the course to pass by the clubhouse.

In 2006 and 2007, \$360,000 was invested into the conversion of the cool-season tees and fairways to a solid stand Zoysia grass. I came on board in February of 2012 and in my first year finished the approaches to Zoysia on holes 12 and 16. Later that summer, we were able to upgrade the irrigation system that included 100 new green side heads, 9 new controllers, and a central computer system. All this was being in-house.

After a brief history lesson, I now know more about the past of the historical land here, the roughly 80 year old barn where I sit and type this, and the development of the golf course we now know as Minor Park.

**Step one:** Open your web browser and navigate to www. hagcsa.org.


**Step two:** Now hit the "Share" button: it's the icon in the middle at the bottom of the page. It represents a page with an arrow coming out of it.
