



- A successful Scholarship and Research Tournament that was held at Oakwood Country Club. The event
 netted over \$20,000 to fund GCSAA Scholarships, Employee Awards, Turfgrass Research, and outreach
 efforts. Thanks again to all who participated, sponsored, or donated auction items for this event. Big
 thanks go out to Jeff Elmer, CGCS, and his assistant, Rose Elmer, as well as the rest of the staff and
 membership of Oakwood Country Club for providing us with a beautiful facility and outstanding service
 despite the inclement weather.
- Awarding \$5,000 in HAGCSA Scholarships. John Daniels from the University of Missouri received \$2,500 for the Chester Mendenhall Scholarship. Derek Branting of Kansas State University received \$1,500 for the Dave Fearis Scholarship and Robert Tibbetts of Kansas State University received \$1,000 for the HAGCSA Scholarship.
- Nicholas Hunter was awarded \$402 for the Employee Awards, helps offset the education expenses for employees of HAGCSA members who are working toward degrees in our industry.
- Supporting the First Tee Program of Kansas City in the amount of \$2,400. Twenty children benefit from our donation spread throughout the five Kansas City metro area First Tee facilities.

A service veteran, Ron spent his young adult years as a Cold War era Intelligence Analyst for the US Army. Pretty heady stuff, Darnell! While on duty at Fort Carson, CO, Ron would meet Susan for the first time. "I had just returned from REFORGER 85 and there was this cute gal with a flat tire who needed help!" Apparently Ron's tire

changing ability must have been impressive enough for Susan to take interest in the poor GI. A life-long romance began. After being discharged from active duty, Ron enrolled at Colorado State with the help of his well-earned GI Bill and graduated Summa cum Laude in 1989.

"At 31, I started in the golf course maintenance field a little later than most," confesses Ron. Fresh out of school,

he landed the Superintendent's job at the Silver Course at the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs. "The Eisenhower Golf Complex is comprised the Blue and Silver courses. They were constructed on campus specifically for Ike, who needed a place to play whenever he visited the Academy," explains Darnell. Ron would spend the next two years honing his skills before making the move to Lawrence, KS in 1991.

Why the move to Kansas? "Good question!" admits Ron. "Lawrence is a tough place for a Mizzou guy to live. If not for the Iowa Staters, it would have been intolerable. (K-state guys intentionally omitted!)" That's right, boys and girls. Darnell is another of the *Stuntzmeister* boys. Alvamar has produced many. Ron would spend the next 4 years there.

"Looking back, those four years under the thumb of Dick at Alvamar, may not have always been the most enjoyable, but it was certainly the most influential part of my greenskeeping journey," confides Ron. Darnell considers Stuntz a mentor and friend. "I would never want to be *just like* Dick, but I appreciate all of the help and guidance he has given to me over the years." In 1995, Ron got the opportunity to flee Jayhawk country and enter Tiger/Bearcat territory.

On Your Mark, Get Set, MOZINGO!

In 1994, the City of Maryville completed construction on a 1000 acre watershed reservoir 3 miles east of town. Boasting over 26 miles of shoreline, Mozingo Lake was born, named after the meandering creek that feeds it. Sur-

rounded by a 3000 acre multi-use park, the citizens of Maryville would not only have an abundant supply of drinking water, they would enjoy a recreational treasure that few communities of their size could ever hope to attain. While in the planning stages, the late Don Sechrest was contracted to design a destination golf course to grace its eastern shore. Ron Darnell was

chosen to become the only Golf Course Superintendent that Mozingo Lakes has ever known. Construction began that same year.

Many of us have experienced a grow-in. Every experience is different. Those who were fortunate enough to sod fairways, tees, banks and noses realize how much easier such instant gratification is

over germinating immature seedbeds at the mercy of Midwestern weather. With over 42 acres of fairways sown to bluegrass and rye surrounded by twice as many acres sown to buffalo and fescue rough, Ron can attest to the perils of heavy rains and washouts. "We had to grow in Mozingo twice and much of that a third time!" Eroding rainfall in the spring of 1995 gutted the new, yet-to-establish turf. "The damage was so extensive that we qualified for and participated in the Federal Disaster Relief program." Nearly all of the rough and a third of the fairways required re-grassing. It was an ongoing monumental task that finally opened to play in 1996. Mozingo has matured well over the years and has become a favorite stop for area golfers.

Darnell understands the regional importance of the facility. "Mozingo is the only 18-hole course for a considerable distance around. Along with the rest of the park, we provide affordable recreational opportunities for NW Missouri, SW Iowa and SE Nebraska." *Gee, he failed to mention NE Kansas, home of the Hawks!*

Asked about the cultivar that was chosen for his greens and the challenges he faces, Ron had this to say. "Crenshaw has many fine attributes but providing a perfect haven for dollar spot is not one of them!"

No one in our business can claim success without building a good, experienced crew. Darnell can attest. "We are definitely a well-seasoned staff up here at Mozingo. The course has been open for over 13 years and the average tenure of the full-time staff is 12 years." Ron has recently taken on the added responsibilities of GM. "Since that has occurred, my long-time Assistant, Tim Wolters has, by all means, assumed the Superintendent role." In addition, Darnell had high praise for his crew chief, Brad Vogel and mechanic, Paul Palmer. Both have been on staff for well over 10 years. Ron speaks of another member of his team in a slightly dif-

ferent vain.

"And then there is Cooter (my faithful lab), who has not missed a day of work in the last 13 years. Even when I was laid up, a member of the staff would pick him up and drive him out to the golf course."

Introspective

Ron's inference of being laid up is in reference to the tragic accident that occurred 4 years ago. On January 11, 2006, Ron and fellow Superintendent, Dan Bowles from Maryville CC were traveling to Overland Park to attend the HAGCSA Educational Conference. The weather that morning was marginal and the roads were becoming slick. Dan's truck hit an icy patch on an overpass on 71 Hiway near Savannah. A roll-over accident ensued, ejecting both from the vehicle. Dan Bowles, age 25, died from his injuries. Ron was left in critical condition, fighting for his life.

Like many of you who read this piece, I remember that day and the dread we all felt when told of the accident that so nearly took the lives of both of our brethren who were traveling to join us that day. Ron's road to recovery has been long and painful. Though he doesn't mind talking about the accident, he reasons, "People don't really enjoy hearing about other's health problems. I will just play the cards as they are dealt." Stoic to this day, he adds, "I do thank the Lord daily for allowing me to stay on this side of the turf and will always keep Daniel's wife, Brooke and son, Colby in my prayers."

Over time, Ron has been able to return to work and resume his role as the steward at Mozingo Lake. His family has continued to flourish. At the Heart Conference in December, a very proud father watched as his 17 year old daughter accepted the Legacy Scholarship, sponsored by Professional Turf Products, our local Toro distributor.

Darnell confesses, "Looking over the roster, I realize there are more and more members I do not know. That would be my fault, but the older I get, the more I dislike traveling down to the hustle and bustle of the city!"

Well you know Ron, it's been said that bearcats are very solitary creatures. Here's hoping that this member profile will allow our membership some insight into Mr. Darnell. All roads lead two directions. Be sure to stop in at Mozingo Lake if you ever get the chance. Ron Darnell, CGCS will want to meet you!



SEEDS TO SUCCESS

We reap what we sow.... How many times have you come up with a great enhancement idea for your golf course or you found the perfect piece of equipment guaranteed to save you time and money only to have the idea or request shot down at first sight? After muttering under your breath for a while, have you taken the time to fully analyze why you were not successful in your quest?

Over my tenure of almost three decades in the business, I've had plenty of ego checks when I thought my brilliant ideas would be equally appreciated and readily accepted by my superiors. After all, they hired me because I know everything and I'm the expert! Well, after nursing many black eyes over the years and pondering each failure to win the crowd, I've developed a two step plan to put the odds for success in my favor.

First, long before any presentation requiring approval is made, I prepare a 5 Year Plan for the golf course. The plan covers course improvements and an equipment replacement schedule which is updated regularly. My plan is kept very fluid with yearly breakdowns. Components of the plan are a combination of ideas gleaned from golfers' input, my observations from daily course inspections, the golf professional's vision for the course and comments from the consulting golf course architect, if one is used. Once the plan is complete, I present the package to my Greens Committee. If nobody requests to see the document, I give it to them during my annual review. This tactic provides a nice conversation piece while demonstrating your commitment and forward thinking.

Next, a strategy to sell the idea is developed. My strategy starts with determining the project's completion date or the drop dead date to have the equipment in hand. With a known deadline, I work my time line backwards. Some-

times a course enhancement may require a year or two of planning the scope of work and networking with as many golfers as possible. Seeds are sown while you are networking. Commingling with your membership is critical to selling the idea, relieving anxieties and getting them to take ownership of the project. During the networking effort, you need to think like a golfer and answer the three main concerns: how does it affect my golf experience; how do you pay for it; and will it save money in the long run. When I have equipment requests, I plan three months time to take ownership. During the first month, I research the equipment, collect bids and introduce the equipment need to my greens committee as part of my monthly golf course report. I don't go overboard in the details with the particular piece of equipment as I "test the waters" and gather visual and verbal feedback. Of course, I re-emphasize to the committee that the equipment is part of a replacement schedule and it fits within our budget parameters. At month two, I present a written request with bids. Within the request, I submit a description, three to five "benefits to be gained," a life expectancy, a warranty notice and any trade-in value. My committee reviews the information, ask me a few questions and then they vote. If

approved, the purchase recommendation is carried to the finance committee the next week. At finance, I re-answer questions regarding bid comparisons, life expectancy, repair costs and the status of trade-ins. Fortunately, the finance committee sticks to their purpose and they only deals with whether the club has the means to pay for the request. Once approved by finance, I present the request to the nine Board of Directors, four of which sit on my committee. They meet the last Tuesday of each month. I make a small presentation and answer any concerns before they vote. If the vote is approved, I contact the vendor the following day. For equipment orders, I plan three to four weeks for the vendor to deliver the equipment which culminates the three month effort.

Regardless of the size of the project or the amount of equipment, I go through the same routine of gaining support long before a formal vote is cast. Most of the time, I know how the vote will turnout. Effective networking or properly sowing the seeds is crucial to gaining approval. Networking is a 24-7 business activity that you perform almost covertly.

As mentioned earlier, I have had my fair share of rejection despite a strong effort. A rejected course enhancement idea or equipment request may be of great value to the facility but not the highest priority at a particular moment. You can never assume, take anything for granted or take rejection personally. As the caretaker of the most valuable asset of your facility, you do your due diligence and let the chips fall as they may. Especially now with the

uncertainty of the Country's economic landscape and our stagnant golf industry, decision makers are usually juggling multiple needs with limited resources. As 2010 unfolds, each of us will need to operate with caution in regards to spending. But, I urge you to stay proactive, positive and keep sowing the seeds for your facilities success.





prosperity is simple – economic freedom plus property rights. In other words, minimal regulation and the right to keep what you earn.

Clearly, we all know that money is a reliable method for motivating people. But, if you ever want to discover the motivation behind an action that appears to be random, backtracking the money trail is frequently a good way to find it. For example, have you ever noticed one of your favorite products disappearing from the store where you buy it? It probably means that there were not enough customers for it and the store quit carrying it. If, however, you can't find it anywhere, then the lack of users is widespread and the manufacturer discontinued it.

Sometimes, however, the money trail is even longer, and more convoluted. I recall a hot summer day, back in the late 1980s, when, after mowing the lawn, I popped open an ice cold soda pop and drained it in one long gulp. Moments later I was on the floor with a painful spasm in my back. It lasted nearly half an hour, and when it was over I made an appointment with my doctor. It turned out I was allergic to the corn syrup in the soda.

"How could that be?" I'd drank thousands of sodas without having that reaction. What I learned was that up until that can of soda all the ones I'd drank before were made with sugar. So, I asked, "Why would they switch to corn syrup?" The answer was that the cost of sugar had gone up and they did not want to raise the price. "Why was sugar more expensive?" Because Congress placed a tariff on imported sugar. "Why did Congress do that?" Sugar growers in Florida asked them to because they did not want to compete with low-cost Carribean sugar. "Why would Congress comply when it would raise prices on all products made with sugar?" Because the sugar growers donated lots of campaign money to a majority of the members of Congress. The trail ends, and the puzzle is solved.

It turns out that my favorite soda pop is still made with sugar in every county on the planet except the United States. One day I'm going to get a craving and drive a thousand miles to Mexico. Talk about motivation!
