**Golf Course History**: Blue Hills Country Club was established in 1912 in an area bounded by the Paseo, 59th Street, Brooklyn and 63rd Streets in Kansas City, Missouri. The Club received it's name from the fields that were covered in beautiful blue grass. In 1963, the Club moved to it's current location.

The golf course, designed by Robert Dunning, is kept in tournament-ready condition and is consistently rated among the top courses in the Midwest. For 25 years, Blue Hills had the honor of hosting Tom Watson's Children's Mercy Hospital Golf Classic. Over the years, this event

raised \$10 million for the hospital and is considered to have been one of the finest and largest grossing events of it's kind. Mr. Watson, an honorary member of Blue Hills, retired this event in 2004.

Mendenhall Award. These prestigious awards will be given out at the Annual **Holiday Party on December 3**. # **Eligibility and Qualifications**

# **Assistant Superintendent of the Year**

This award will be presented annually to the assistant who has demonstrated dedication and excellence at their job over the past year.

The guidelines are as follows:

- 1. Must be a member of the Heart of America.
- 2. Must be an assistant that represents their profession to the highest degree.
- 3. Must be at their present course for no less than two seasons.
- 4. This award shall be governed by the assistant's achievements in any of the following.
  - Competency in agronomic skills
  - Ability to efficiently run the daily operations of the course
  - Effectively running course projects
  - Assisting in the preparation of their course for regional or national events
  - Involvement with local, regional, or national turf related associations
  - Strong involvement in course renovations and new course construction
  - Goal oriented and striving to become a superintendent
  - Exceptional contributions to this association through involvement
- 5. These accomplishments must have occurred in the current year.

# Superintendent of the Year

This award, established in 1970, has been presented annually to the golf course superintendent who has demonstrated dedication and outstanding service to his or her profession.

The guidelines are as follows:

- 1. Must be a "Class A or Superintendent Member" in good standing.
- 2. Must be a superintendent that represents the organization and himself to the highest degree.
- 3. This award shall be governed by the superintendents achievements in either:
  - Excellence in golf course management
  - Preparation of his or her course for regional or national golf tournaments
  - Achievements for renovation or new golf course construction
  - Involvement with local, regional, or national turf related associations
  - Exceptional contributions to this association through involvement
- 4. These accomplishments must have occurred in the current year.

# **Chester H. Mendenhall Award**

This award has been established to honor an individual who has devoted extensive time and effort to the promotion of golf, the art of greenskeeping and other related fields. Begun in 1983, this award is named after a golf course superintendent who dedicated his life to his profession.

The guidelines are as follows:

- 1. Must be a HAGCSA member in good standing.
- 2. Must be an individual that represents the organization and him or herself to the highest degree.
- 3. This award shall be governed by the individual's achievements over an extended period of time:
  - Outstanding service to this organization
  - Involvement with local, regional, or national turf related organizations
  - Continued support and service to the golf industry or his/her community





# **Attaboy!**

Seventeen years ago, I became the president of my community association. It was a lively organization with scores of activist members who were busy gentrifying an inner city neighborhood. One of my responsibilities was to deliver a monthly speech and conduct a formal meeting with a loud and raucous crowd.

Over the course of my two year stint, I always spoke from behind the lectern with my hands firmly attached to the sides in a white knuckle grip as I read from my notes. When my term ended, I felt that I might have been a more effective leader if I had some real speaking skills, and if I wasn't so afraid of being in front of an audience.

So, I joined a Toastmaster's club and began my training as a public speaker. A year later, I had completed ten speeches and the basic program, but I was still firmly attached to both the lectern and my notes. My mentors encouraged me to work without notes and to move away from the lectern. "At least stand to one side of it!" they cajoled. But I was not about to leave my comfort zone. I was plenty uncomfortable just giving a speech. Besides no one could see my legs shaking behind the lectern.

Then the club held a speech contest. A humorous speaking contest. Now, I can tell jokes, so I was game! Four of us entered the competition, and I managed to win the third place ribbon without venturing an inch beyond the safety of the lectern. I can't recall who placed second, but I'll never forget the winner. Les Satterfield talked about an airplane flight and he soared about the room with his arms spread wide and the audience roared in laughter at his comic yarn. Later on, as I watched him receive his shiny gold statuette for First Place, I knew I had to have one. I was motivated... but not quite enough.

The next contest was for a motivational speech. Once again, I sought refuge behind the lectern. I managed to win the second place ribbon, but the gold went to Doris Posey who moved about the room and interacted with the audience.

I finally took First Place with the Tall Tales contest. I wrote my speech then practiced, practiced, practiced. On the day of the competition -- I did it -- I stepped out from behind the lectern! I told how I would pretend to be Tom Hank's younger brother whenever I flew first class, and how much fun it was to fool my fellow passengers, that was until the time I sat next to his mother.

I loved the recognition that came with that First Place trophy. It motivated me to go further; and forced me to get better. In order to win at higher levels within Toastmasters, I had to develop excellent speaking and speechwriting skills.

I went on to win 13 contests.
Years later, when I was hired to
give my first professional speech,
I wondered whether or not I
was truly worthy of getting paid to

speak. As I began to have doubts, I looked at those 13 gold trophies in my office bookcase. They represented the acknowledgment that I was indeed worthy.

A few years ago, I visited successful professional speaker, David Greenberg, in his home. I smiled in understanding as I saw, prominently displayed in his living room, several Toastmaster contest trophies.

Recognition doesn't have to be tangible to be effective. A clap on the back, a verbal "Good Job!" in front of peers and co-workers, or a blurb in the company newsletter works too. Even so, nothing works quite as long or as powerfully as something hard and shiny with a name engraved on it. However, you don't want someone resting on their laurels; to keep them motivated, put a date on those plaques and trophies. Then encourage them to renew it every year.
