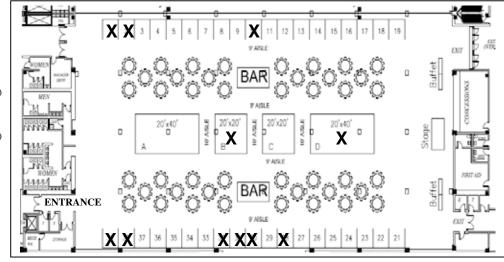

## Do You Remember.... I Know I'll Never Forget!

9/11/01: Could 10 years have really passed? Where were you? What were you doing? Did you lose any friends or loved ones? Did you fear "The End" was coming? I'm sure all of us can remember that fateful day. The day that brought America to our knees and together simultaneously.

I had just become a father for the second time just six days earlier. My daughter, Elle Grace, is now 10 and remembers nothing about it. How could she? I had just returned to work that morning. It was an awesome fall day. Full sun and not a cloud in the sky. I was mowing the 9th fairway at Falcon Ridge which runs from north to south. I was running on very little rest and daydreaming about my new baby girl. When all of the sudden, I noticed jets making u-turns in the sky. I didn't know if what I was seeing was real or just lack of sleep. Upon finishing the hole, I stopped in the clubhouse. Everyone was glued to the televisions. That is when I too knew that the day would never be forgotten.

What or how have you changed in the past 10 years? How has America changed? Lately, the economic times have changed. The golf business sure has changed as well. Are the changes for the good or bad? Only time will tell.

The days of 400+ course openings a year are long gone. We're lucky to not have at least that many closing each year. The big budgets have seen cuts and the small budgets are even smaller. Most private clubs are down members and public facilities are fighting tooth and nail for every dollar. Assistants are staying in jobs longer or leaving the business. Superintendent jobs are scarce at best. Jobs that used to field 15-20 applicants now have over 200.

We have had back to back extreme weather summers. Some turf managers have fared better than others. We collectively like to piss and moan, bitch, complain, whine, etc. "It's too hot, too cold, too wet, too dry, etc." I, like many of us, fall into this group. I guess we should all grow grass in areas like northern Michigan or southern California.

After all, we chose our path, our location, our own destiny. It didn't choose us. We chose to fight the fight here, deal with the extremes, and conquer

whatever obstacles come our way. Those affected by the 911 tragedy were not so lucky. Their destiny was chosen by terrorists. They woke and went to work like it was any other beautiful fall day.

Looking back at 9/11/01, I can't even begin to understand the feelings, pain, or helplessness those people must have felt. We'll never comprehend the amounts of loss and suffering endured. So, as we head into the fall season, and "life is good" again back on the course, let's keep things in perspective. We all take great pride in our work. We all deal with angry and nagging members or customers. We all work long and hard hours. Yet we weren't there, and can only imagine what life is like after such a tragedy.

After all, "it's just grass." It will grow back. As I think of those affected by the terrorist attacks, I thank the Lord every day for what I have, and that I'm still here fighting the fight. It's often times of remembrance that we all can gather strength to push through the "hard times."

We are all so lucky to share in the fraternity of "the turf heads." I am so thankful and grateful for all of the personal and professional relationships that I have gained through our collective "ups and downs."

"Let's Roll" into another not long enough off season, and hopefully not so brutal upcoming season!

#### **Superintendent of the Year**

This award, established in 1970, has been presented annually to the golf course superintendent who has demonstrated dedication and outstanding service to his or her profession.

The guidelines are as follows:

- 1. Must be a "Class A <u>or</u> Superintendent Member" in good standing.
- 2. Must be a superintendent that represents the organization and himself to the highest degree.
- 3. This award shall be governed by the superintendents achievements in either:
  - Excellence in golf course management
  - Preparation of his or her course for regional or national golf tournaments
  - Achievements for renovation or new golf course construction
  - Involvement with local, regional, or national turf related associations
  - Exceptional contributions to this association through involvement
- 4. These accomplishments must have occurred in the current year.

#### Chester H. Mendenhall Award

This award has been established to honor an individual who has devoted extensive time and effort to the promotion of golf, the art of greenskeeping and other related fields. Begun in 1983, this award is named after a golf course superintendent who dedicated his life to his profession.

## GCSAA Celebrates 85 years Association founded Sept. 13, 1926

On Sept. 13, 1926, 60 dedicated greenskeepers gathered at Sylvania Country Club in Toledo, Ohio, to lay the groundwork for the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. Led by Col. John Morley, the greenskeeper of Youngstown (Ohio) Country Club, the group formed the National Association of Greenskeepers of America (after several name changes, it became GCSAA in 1951). Morley had found benefit in uniting members of the profession after helping establish the Cleveland District Greenskeepers Association in 1923. A year later, at the first annual meeting of NAGA in Chicago, 72 superintendents signed on as charter members. Today GCSAA has grown to 19,000 members throughout the world.

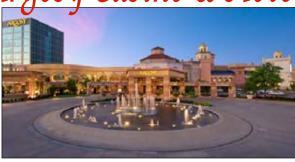

## The Magic of Commitment is No Mystery

### **By Robert Evans Wilson**

"Who want to be chairperson of the Fundraising Committee?" asked the President.

The room became very quiet, and as I glanced around the table, I saw a dozen perfect poker faces. No one wanted this responsibility. No one was going to commit.

After a moment the President continued, "This is our most important committee, without funding we cannot put on our program to teach leadership skills to high school students."

It was my first year on the executive committee of the Georgia chapter of the Hugh O'Brian Youth Foundation (HOBY). I had no idea how they previously raided the \$50,000 a year that was necessary to operate. As an advertising consultant, I'd helped raise millions of dollars for several national non-profits with direct mail advertising. So, I thought, "How hard can this be?"

I raised my hand and said, "I'll do it." A collective sigh issued from the group and several congratulated me on accepting such a big responsibility. I basked in the accolades and beamed an appreciative smile back to everyone.

It didn't take but a few days before I was lementing, "What the heck was I thinking?"

I learned that my predecessors has solicited most of the money in a handful of big donations from a small group of donors. Unfortunately, those donors were feeling tapped out, and were no longer willing to give. I couldn't back out of the job - I'd made a commitment! All I needed was a Plan B.

I quickly got on the phone and started telling everyone I knew what I was trying to accomplish. Someone suggested that I apply for grants from the charitable foundations of large corporations. Three dozen applications later, I had nothing to show for my hours of work. I now needed a Plan C.

When I volunteered, I had a vague notion that I would simply raise all that money with a direct mail campaign. The campaigns I'd worked on in the past had mega-budgets in the hundreds of thousands of dollars and major advertising agencies involved. I had no budget and only five or six volunteers to help out. Even if I had a budget, I didn't know to whom I should send my direct mail solicitations. I knew from experience that retirees are among the best donors, but purchasing a list of generous givers was expensive! About that time a fellow in the concession business who I worked with when I was president of my neighborhood association, called me to see if I knew any groups that could operate a beer stand at an annual weekend-long outdoor rock concert. I said, "Do I ever!"

We raised \$10,000 in three days. We did such a good job,

we were asked to come back every year. It was a big job that required more people than we had, so we recruited help from outside of the organization.

That turned out to be easy because the people who volunteered got into the concert free for that day. Many of them had so much fun, they volunteered to help put on the youth leadership seminars for which HOBY

is known. As an unexpected side benefit, it became our best vehicle for recruiting volunteers for the next several years.

I still had \$40,000 to raise. I learned from one old-timer that in years past HOBY received donations from the Kiwanis clubs. I called a friend who was a member. He told me that HOBY was on the Kiwanis International approved list of charities. This was huge! It meant we already had a foot in the door. He then helped me acquire a mailing list of all the clubs in the state.

I now had what I needed for a direct mail campaign. I wrote to every club and asked them to sponsor one child from each high school in their area. I then set up a phone bank of volunteers to call the clubs and ask them directly for a donation. We raised more than we needed! Best of all, we now had two programs in place for raising funds year after year.

I have found over the years that when you commit to a project whether it is starting a business, a new relationship or learning a new skill, opportunities arise that you ordinarily would not have noticed.

William Hutchinson Murray, from his 1951 book entitled, The Scottish Himalayan Expedition, says it best, "Until one is committed, there is hesitancy, the chance to draw back. Concerning all acts of initiative (and creation), there is one elementary truth, the ignorance of which kills countless ideas and splendid plans: that the moment one definitely commits oneself, then Providence moves too. All sorts of things occur to help one that would never otherwise have occurred. A whole stream of events issues from the decision, raising in one's favor all manner of unforeseen incidents and meetings and material assistance, which no man could have dreamed would have come his way."

I've always called this initiating the Discovery Process because when you combine your commitment - your powerful desire - to solve a problem or satisfy a particular

need, your subconscious mind will work on it 24/7.

To understand how this works, think of the last time you were in the market for a new car. After shopping the market, you selected a particilar make and model. Up until that time you hardly evernoticed that car on the road, but now that you have committed to it – suddenly you see them everywhere! Opportunities present themselves in the same way.

Commitment has a way of creating its own motivation. Go for it - and see what comes your way!

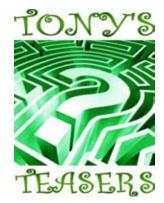
